 - MSAA Science (Grades 5, 8, and 11)
- Stand-Alone Field Tests (All Students must participate)!
 - AZELLA (Oct 11-Dec 10, 2021) (COMPLETED)
 - AASA Writing (January 24 March 4, 2022) (COMPLETED)
- National Assessment of Educational Progress (COMPLETED)

Data Reporting

For Field Tests- no results/data are provided. This includes AZELLA Stand-Alone Field Test, AASA Writing Stand-Alone Field Test and Oral Reading Fluency items embedded into AASA.

For AzSCI and ACT - ADE will be conducting a Standard Setting in June with results later than normal

For AASA Grades 3-8 Results will be available on or before May 15th for Grade 3 and May 25th for Grades 4-8

Move on When Reading

 The student will be given a reading passage and will record themselves reading for one minute.

Note: After Standard Setting- the performance on these items will not be reported out separately, they will be reported under a current reporting category

- Students can practice in testing platform (Grade 3 Sample Test)
- Can be administered in small groups
- Similar to AZELLA Speaking Test

ACT Aspire and ACT - Similarities

- Available online and paper-based check specific test windows
- Content areas included: English, Math, Reading, Science, Writing
- Test sections are timed
- Accommodated Extended time available. See Accommodations Manual for details
- Text-to-Speech and Speech-to-Text are allowable accommodations which must be approved
 - Both have Test Administration Directions, which must be followed
- ✓ Monitoring of test by Proctor or Test Administrator
- ✓ Online tests are administered in TestNav

ACT Aspire and ACT - Differences

- Online embedded calculator: ACT Desmos Scientific Calculator; Aspire non-branded scientific calculator. See <u>ACT Calculator Policy</u> for information about allowable handheld calculators.
- Aspire test sections may be administered in any order and in one day or over multiple days. ACT (standard administration) test sections must be administered in one day in a certain order. See <u>Detailed Test Calendar</u> for details.
- ✓ Students complete MyACT for ACT only (not available for Aspire)
- ✓ <u>ACT Aspire webpage</u> and <u>ACT Aspire Schedule of Events</u>

- iPads are not supported or allowed for ACT testing but are supported and allowed for Aspire.
- ACT accommodations and supports requests must be submitted to ACT by January 7, 2022. Aspire accommodations and supports are to be submitted to ADE using secure form: https://www.azed.gov/assessment/achievement_aa_fy22 by February 25, 2022.
- ✓ ACT hard copies of manuals will be sent; ACT Aspire manuals are online only

ACT Aspire (Grade 9/Cohort 2025)

- ✓ Content areas and time limits:
 - ✓ English 62 items / 45-minute test
 - ✓ Math 48 items / 75-minute test
 - ✓ Reading 32 items / 65-minute test
 - ✓ Science 44 items / 60-minute test
 - Writing 40-minute essay
- ✓ Content areas may be administered in any order
- ✓ Test sections may be administered in one day or over multiple days.
- ✓ Student Sandbox and Exemplar Booklets

- ✓ Item types:
 - ✓ English Multiple-Choice
 - ✓ Math Multiple-Choice and Constructed-Response

- Students will write an analytical expository essay in response to a writing stimulus

ACT (Grade 11/Cohort 2023)

 - ✓ English 75 items / 45-minute test
 - ✓ Math 60 items / 60-minute test
 - ✓ Reading 40 items / 35-minute test
 - ✓ Science 40 items / 35-minute test
 - ✓ Writing 40-minute essay
- ✓ Content areas must be administered in order listed above
- Testing must be completed in one day unless student has received an ACTapproved accommodation for testing over multiple days

- ✓ Items on English, Math, Reading, and Science sections are multiple-choice.
- Students receive one writing prompt that describes a complex issue and provides three perspectives. Students will write an essay explaining their perspective on the issue.
- College-reportable composite score (from the English, Math, Reading, and Science sections) and a STEM score (from the Math and Science sections) will be provided

- Assessment will be available online and paper based. Schools will select a test window and online or paper test administration in PAN in Fall 2021.
- Content areas include English, Math, Reading, Science, and Writing. The Writing portion of the assessment is an essay.
- This assessment is the high school requirement for ELA and Mathematics. Students must also take AzSCI for their high school Science requirement.

- DTCs will attend Arizona-specific webinars in Fall 2021 for test administration information and accommodations information.
- ✓ LEAs must submit requests for accommodations in ACT's Test Accessibility & Accommodations (TAA) System – opens September 15. Submit requests early!

- Aligned to new ELP Standards
- New grade configuration (Kindergarten, Grade 1, Grades 2-3, Grades 4-5, Grades 6-8, and Grades 9-12)
- Will focus on productive, receptive, and interactive language from the ELP Standards
- Will no longer have domain-specific sections (L,R,W, and S)
- Will have units; may have thematic sets of Reading and Writing items or Listening and Speaking items in one unit
- New Sample Tests will be available in late Spring 2022

- ADE's review and approval for Additional Accommodations/SPV are required before AZELLA can be administered
- Transition to Braille versions for AZELLA Stages III V Contact ADE
- Domain Scoring (for eligible students only) Contact ADE

Entrance and Exit Criteria

- Entrance: Home Language Survey (upon first AZ enrollment, beginning Kindergarten) determines eligibility for AZELLA Placement Test
- Exit: Proficiency on AZELLA Overall Proficiency Level of Proficient (Proficient score in Reading, Writing, and Total Combined)




